SWEEP THE HOOCH

Saturday, March 22, 2025 Chattahoochee Watershed

In 2025, Sweep the Hooch will celebrate 15 years by continuing to host the southeast region's largest one-day, watershed-wide litter cleanup. Sweep hosts more than 60 cleanup sites spread over 200 river miles from the headwaters in Helen, through Atlanta, and down to Columbus. Sweep the Hooch is THE spring cleanup event making a difference in all our communities throughout the Chattahoochee watershed.

In the last 14 years of Sweeping, 12,000 volunteers have removed 268 TONS of trash, tires, and recyclables from parks, creeks, and the river we all share. Of that, more than 32 tons were recycled.

This event is hosted in partnership with local, state, and national organizations and businesses with a presence in the Chattahoochee watershed. We rely on the support of sponsors to host a cleanup of this magnitude.

RIVER RENDEZVOUS

Fall 2025

Every fall, Chattahoochee Riverkeeper works with partners to organize a series of community water-sampling events. These River Rendezvous events help provide a one-day snapshot of water quality in the Chattahoochee River Basin while engaging people in hands-on environmental stewardship.

No previous water monitoring experience is necessary! Volunteers gather for training before heading out to nearby creeks with their sampling kits. After collecting their samples, volunteers return to the starting point for lunch while our staff and interns begin analyzing various water quality parameters.

The series includes: Headwaters River Rendezvous in Gainesville, Westside River Rendezvous in Atlanta, and Columbus River Rendezvous in Columbus. These events are fun, family-friendly opportunities to demonstrate that we all have a hand in protecting our water resources. Your support helps ensure the success of these events.

Floating Classroom

Chattahoochee Riverkeeper operates the only two floating classrooms in Georgia: the Lake Lanier Aquatic Learning Center and the West Point Lake Floating Classroom. The program engages students through a STEMbased, hands-on science curriculum that is tailored for each grade level and meets state education performance standards.

Each year, around 8,000 students join us for an outing! For some, it's their first time on the water. Our goal is to offer the program to as many participants as possible regardless of their ability to pay. Your contribution will fund scholarships for students from Title I schools and communitybased programs for low-income families to experience the floating classroom program (scholarships are \$35/student).

Trash-Free Chattahoochee

The volume of garbage in our rivers, lakes, and oceans is a global crisis. For more than three decades, Chattahoochee Riverkeeper has carried out an ever-growing Trash-Free Chattahoochee campaign to rid our watershed

of trash, tires, and recyclables. We employ devices called "trash traps" to remove floating litter from tributaries of Chattahoochee River. Since the program's inception in 2019, CRK's trash traps have collected over 15,000 pounds of floating trash. Approximately 40% of the volume of collected trash is recycled. \$5,000 will help maintain a trash trap for one year.

We have also organized hundreds of volunteer cleanups and more than 20,000 volunteers have removed more than three million pounds of trash and recyclables from the watershed. **Your support will sustain this effort in 2025.**

Neighborhood Water Watch

Neighborhood Water Watch is a collaborative program between CRK and neighborhood groups, schools, and individual volunteers in our watershed.

Volunteers collect water samples from more than 200 sites on the river, lakes, and creeks each week and bring them to one of our four laboratories located in Atlanta, Columbus, Gainesville, and LaGrange. Once there, water samples are analyzed for bacteria that may indicate pollution or other water quality issues. The data is then made available to the public on our website. Any threats indicated – such as sediment pollution or unsafe bacteria levels – are addressed by CRK, as we work with local utilities, local governments, neighborhood groups, and community leaders to stop these public health threats.

Your support will keep our laboratories stocked with supplies, equip our volunteer sample kits and training, and provide CRK staff with the resources to track down pollution in our waterways.
